#### DAY 3 | TOURING NEW ORLEANS & ST. PATRICK'S DAY!

This morning it's time to dress in green and head out to enjoy breakfast on your own. Meet back at the hotel and depart as a group for a tour of the New Orleans Historic District. See the sights you've heard about for years such as the historic French Quarter, the beautiful Garden District, the colorful River Walk along the Mississippi and famous Bourbon Street. This evening, enjoy The Patrick's Day Parade from a restaurant in the French Quarter, and an included dinner. The Grand Parade starts at 7:00 PM right in the French Quarter. Watch out as they not only throw beads, but cabbages at this parade!



# Day 4 | TOURING A SOUTHERN MANSION & MARDI GRAS WORLD

After breakfast, journey beyond the city limits of New Orleans and discover Oak Alley Plantation at the end of a long road surrounded by live oaks. Discover what it is like to live in another time as you are guided through the lovingly restored main house and its exhibits by a costumed guide. Wander among the other authentic buildings on the plantation grounds, see daily demonstration, or browse through authentic gifts in the Gift Shop. Enjoy some time to eat lunch here. Then depart for a stop at New Orleans in the Spring with St Patrick's Day! one of the most famous cemeteries in the world - St. Louis Cemetery No. 1. The oldest cemetery in the city, dating back to 1789. It's renowned for its above-ground tombs, and is a fascinating place to take a stroll and contemplate the meaning of life. Continue on to Mardi Gras World where you will learn what goes into the making of the Mardi Gras parade floats. Since 1947, the artists of Blaine Kern Studios have been bringing Mardi Gras to life, creating many of the parade floats, from concept through completion. The colors, the lights, the music, the "joie de vivre" is all in one magical place. You'll get a behind the scenes look at the world's largest fleet of carnival floats and everything that goes into making Mardi Gras such an international phenomenon. Enjoy a free sample of King Cake, a traditional Mardi Gras Treat!

# DAY 5 | THE NATIONAL WWII MUSEUM AND ST. JOSEPHS DAY PARADE

This morning, head to the National WWII Museum.



This remarkable attraction illuminates the American experience during the WWII era. Celebrate the American Spirit as you experience moving personal stories, historic artifacts and powerful interactive displays, from the Normandy invasion to the sands of Pacific Islands, the museum salutes the optimism, courage and sacrifice of those who won the war and changed the world. Delight in St. Joseph's Day Parade later on in the evening. The Italian-American Community hosts this annual event with the gentlemen handing out roses to all the ladies in the crowd, and sometimes dipping them for a kiss on the cheek! The floats are filled with the young ladies of the Italian community all dressed in white. A lovely parade! Enjoy an included last night dinner in the area, but don't stay out too late as you must pack for home!
