Along the way, enjoy an included stop at Stonehenge to visit these ancient ruins. You will then arrive in Bath where you will check into your centrally located hotel. You are then free to explore the area for the rest of the day. Maybe visit the Roman Baths or dine at the famous "Pump House" where all the fashionable people ate back in the 1700s. Then enjoy an included "Welcome Dinner" at a local restaurant.

April 26 | Cornwall (Falmouth), England

England's southwest corner is steeped in legend & history. Tintagel Castle in Cornwall is the traditional



birthplace of King Arthur. Falmouth, which boasts a superb deep-water harbour - the third-largest in the world - shares the Cornish coast's colorful history of shipwrecks, smuggling & privateering. Cornwall is scenic England at its best, with superb seascapes, picturesque harbors & countryside of green fields & hedgerows, quaint villages & low-slung granite farmhouses. One of the southernmost locations in England, enjoy the small palm trees as you tour this beach destination.

April 27 | Sea Day

Today enjoy a full day of cruising at sea! The heart of this beautiful ship is the impressive three-decked Centre Court where you will find Dicken's for some refreshment, Ambassador Casino, shopping galleria, photo gallery, & destination experiences. Other facilities on Ambition include Coffee House, Aces & Eights Bridge & Card room, Kapoor's Crafters Studio, Bronte's Library, Active Studio, gym, and Wellness Spa. Don't forget to take tea in dining room this afternoon! In addition to all of this, the evening brings even more delights with a wonderful 5-course dinner, entertainment & dancing to follow. Sea days are just fantastic!

April 28 | Bantry, Ireland

Founded in the 7th century by St. Fin Barre, Bantry is your gateway to romantic Ireland. Stroll down narrow country lanes or see the Lakes of Killarney in Killarney National Park. You might hire a jaunting cart & Jarvey driver to take you by horse through the park. The region around Bantry is also home to one of the densest concentration of prehistoric monuments in Western Europe. And, in a land where fable & fact blend to become folklore, it was near Cork that the great Tuatha De Danaan, a race with magical powers, was driven underground by the conquering Celts!

April 29 | Cork, Ireland (Cobh)

Cobh was the single most important port of emigration from Ireland. Here the Titanic made its last stop before heading out to sea on its disastrous voyage. If you wish, you may visit the museum here dedicated to its

The grounds there are very beautiful, & you will also have an opportunity to visit the Blarney Woolen Mills right next to the castle for some wonderful lamb's wool Irish sweaters!

April 30 | Belfast, Northern Ireland

The capital of Northern Ireland - part of the United Kingdom - Belfast has experienced a renaissance since the Good Friday Agreement of 1998 that promised an end to the decades-old "Troubles" between Catholics and Protestants. Stretching along both sides of the River Lagan, this graceful city of Victorian and Edwardian buildings has become a cosmopolitan tourist destination. If you like, visit the Titanic Museum, the largest in the world, located where the ship itself was built. Explore this exuberant city, marvel at the Giant's Causeway just up the coast, or shop for the superb Irish linens produced in the area!

May 1 | Sea Day

As you head southward, spend your last day at sea enjoying all the amenities the ship has to offer. Enjoy relaxing on-board with newfound friends in a game of cards. Enjoy learning a new craft, or just hang out in the comfortable chairs on-board with a good book. Get outside & walk around the deck enjoying the brisk sea air or work out in the gym. By now you will have made a lot of new British friends. Make sure you exchange addresses so you can meet up once again someday! Don't forget to pack your suitcase for your departure home tonight. Then head off to one last dinner, a show & dancing in the disco before heading off to sleep!
